The annual Sponsored Ride and Stride, organised by the Nottinghamshire Historic Churches Trust, takes place on Saturday, 11th September between 10am and 6pm and it is hoped over 240 churches and chapels of all denominations will take part in the effort.

The event is for both cyclists and walkers and each church maps out its own route, taking in an average of five or six churches, with riders and walkers being sponsored according to how many churches they visit. Individuals are allowed to have their own itinerary in regard to visiting a different number of churches.

Those taking part are offered refreshments at each venue they visit and some of the churches hold open days to coincide with the event which takes place on the same day countrywide and which raises annually around £1.5m for the National Churches Trust, which itself provides cash to help repair places of worship built before 1939. County Organiser, Mike Elliott, in charge of the event for the seventh year running, says that churches have teams ranging from just two or three people to as many as 20, with most of them having a route taking in five or six churches although some people manage up to 20. Mike said: "People can walk if they can't get a bike and because a lot of churchgoers are elderly we allow them to be sponsored for the number of hours they sit in their church, recording visitors on the day".

Campaign for anniversary coin and stamp to mark 350th anniversary for 1662 Book of Common Prayer

People are being urged to back a campaign calling on the Royal Mint and Royal Mail to recognise the 350th anniversary of the 1662 Book of Common Prayer by issuing a special coin and stamp.

Although the anniversary is not until 2012, the Prayer Book Society (PBS) said it needed supporters to act now as choices for commemorative coins and stamps were made long before the actual event.

The charity, which campaigns for the continued use of Archbishop Thomas Cranmer's famous 1662 prayer book, is asking people to help by contacting the Royal Mint and Royal Mail.

The Book of Common Prayer has been used in Anglican churches since the Reformation, and is still used regularly for services in cathedrals and churches throughout England despite more modern versions.

Trevor Butler, PBS press officer, said: "We are told that while the Royal Mint is always pleased to receive new ideas for commemorative themes, only a very limited number of United Kingdom commemorative coins are issued each year and a great deal of effort goes into the selection of appropriate themes.

"Chosen anniversaries invariably relate to significant royal occasions or the commemoration of major moments in British history.

"Let's overwhelm the Royal Mail with requests to commemorate the 350th anniversary of the 1662 Book of Common Prayer, perhaps featuring a picture of Archbishop Cranmer holding his famous book." Although the PBS acknowledges 2012 is an important year with the Olympics and the Queen's Diamond Jubilee, it asks supporters to write to Joseph Payne at the Royal Mint and Russell Hawkins at the Royal Mail and suggest the prayer book's anniversary is marked. They could suggest alternative images for the commemorative stamp and coin, or just add their voice to the overall campaign, the charity said.

Notts Historic Churches Trust

Waste Recycling Environmental Limited Landfill Sites will no longer be using the NHCT (or any of the County Trusts) as their vehicle for administering grants to local churches. This means that the Trust will have significantly less funds available on an annual basis to provide grant aid to churches in this Diocese, and they have had to reduce their maximum grants to 12.5% of total project costs, or £2,000 whichever is the lesser. There will be no grants available for Disabled Access projects, as these were also funded by WREN monies.

Since NHCT now have to raise all the funds themselves from which grants are being made, they are emphasising the importance of supporting the annual Bike Ride. They are encouraging local churches to make themselves aware of their activities, and the practical assistance and tailored advice they offer, as well as the repair and community grants which could be available to them. The Trust have been strong supporters of our buildings and often gone that extra mile in an effort to help struggling churches in our Diocese.

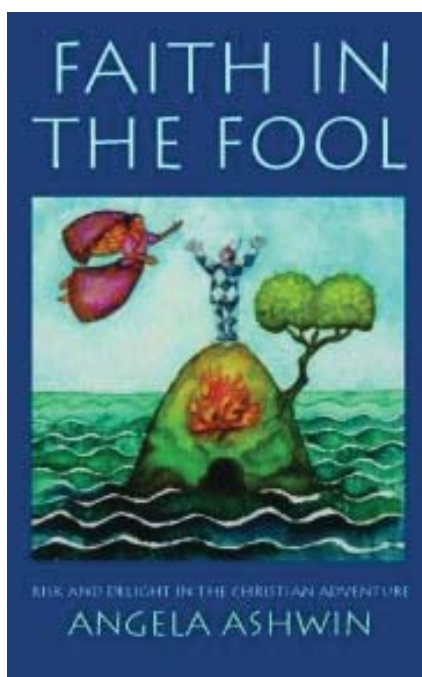

Spending time with people is more important than clock watching

Link Officer, Barbara Holbrook writes:

As we break for the summer holidays, our friends in Natal continue to work. The schools have a fortnight break in July, but their main summer break is in their summer – which coincides with Christmas. For many people in Natal, holidays are something that they can only dream of, for various reasons.

A lot of the older people have sons and daughters who have moved abroad, so their grandchildren live in America, Australia, the UK or somewhere else. For them, their break is to save up the airfare to visit family. They can't do that every year, so in between times they don't have a break away.

For some people, they can't afford to travel. They live on a subsistence wage and rely on being able to work each day to put food on the table. If they don't work, they will earn nothing.

For far too many people, the strict timetable for their HIV/ AIDS medication, where they must eat and take their medication at the same time every day, leaves them with little chance to take a break



from their everyday life.

On the other hand, South Africa is a beautiful land, and there are opportunities for leisure and relaxation close at hand. I remember visiting one of the projects in northern Natal where they had photos of a day trip to the beach. The children (and adults) rarely had a chance to go to such places, and the hour's drive to the coast was a fantastic experience. It is one of the great joys of post-apartheid South Africa that the beaches are open to everyone. It is even more of a joy that there is a whole generation now who have never known it to be any other way.

With the World Cup spotlight on Africa, the Durban Beach Front has been renovated to become a vibrant place where new buildings complement the beautiful sandy beaches and warm water of the Indian Ocean.

As we spend time on a break from our normal activities, another thing that we can learn from our South African friends is the pace of life that they live. For them, spending time with people is more important than clock watching. How often we sacrifice the former for the sake of the latter.

Please pray for those whose lives are restricted by the regime of medication for HIV / AIDS, those families where there is only a days work between them and hunger and for those whose families are far away. Also, pray for ourselves, that we may spend holidays relaxing and enjoying the company of family and friends.

Christmas is coming

The Revd Martin Kirkbride, Holy Trinity Lenton, writes:

“As we get back from summer breaks, survive the rigours of harvest suppers, then rapidly find that Christmas is rushing towards us. The most common strategy is to dust off what we did last year and why not – it probably went down very well. But how do we stimulate fresh thinking, imaginative outreach, and creative worship, as well as capitalizing on the traditional?”
