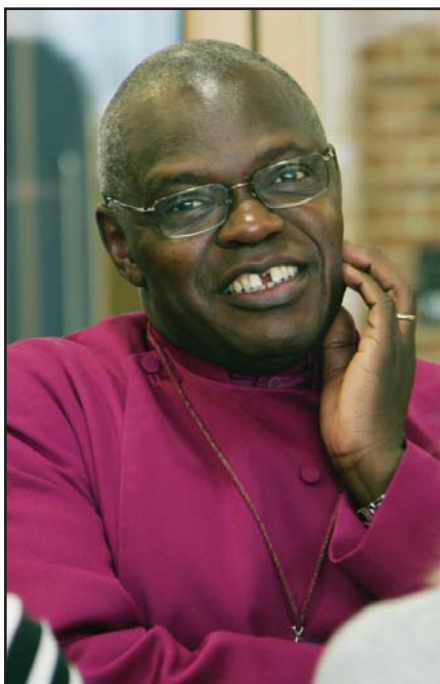


## Archbishop of York's visit to include 'Light Party' in Southwell Minster

The Archbishop of York, Dr John Sentamu will be joining children in a Light Show Party at Southwell Minster when he spends two days visiting people and projects around Nottinghamshire in October 2011.



The Archbishop's visit, which is being coordinated by the Diocese of Southwell & Nottingham, will begin on Monday 31st October at Staythorpe Power Station. During the first day, Dr Sentamu will meet church and farming communities and visit a youth employment project, run by the homelessness charity Framework, in Sutton-in-Ashfield. A highlight of the programme will be a special service and activity event on the Monday evening, called 'Shine the Light', with hundreds of children and young people in Nottinghamshire's ancient cathedral.

Children's Ministry Adviser, Nick Harding, said: "The evening will have a 'come and go as you like' feel, with the focus being a light show and act of worship at 6.30pm. This event is designed for all ages – children, young people, families, individuals – there will be something for everyone! There's no need to book, and the event is free, so now's the time to think about bringing your youth group, children's groups, uniformed organisations, and everyone else." Nick explained that there will be activities and crafts, as well as refreshments available.

Following the Light event, the Archbishop will join the High Sheriff of Nottingham, Sir John Peace and other guests for a dinner in the

## New principal for St John's College

The Revd Dr David Hilborn is to be the next principal of St John's Theological College, Nottingham.

Dr Hilborn becomes the College's seventh Principal since its move from London to Nottingham forty years ago. He will succeed Canon Dr Christina Baxter when she retires next year after 15 years as Principal. Dr Hilborn, 47, is at present Director of the North Thames Ministerial Training Course and Assistant Dean of St Mellitus College. He has over twenty years' experience as an ordained

## Event aims to inspire change through joint action in local communities

New ways of tackling poverty, addiction, crime and isolation were showcased at a special forum in Hucknall which brought together a host of local organisations keen to work together to make a difference across local communities.

The special event entitled, 'ROC Nottingham', was jointly organised by the national Redeeming Our Communities charity, the Bishop of Sherwood and Nottinghamshire Police. About 140 people gathered for the evening, when representatives from charities and organisations shared some of their work in tackling debt, poverty, rehabilitation of offenders and helping people conquer addictions.

The Bishop of Sherwood, the Rt Revd Tony Porter said: "It was fantastic to see so many different organisations coming together to make a difference. There are some absolutely inspirational people working across Nottinghamshire and if we begin to spread the word about these projects and see them rolled out in more communities, we will see the city and county continue to be transformed and people's lives turned around."

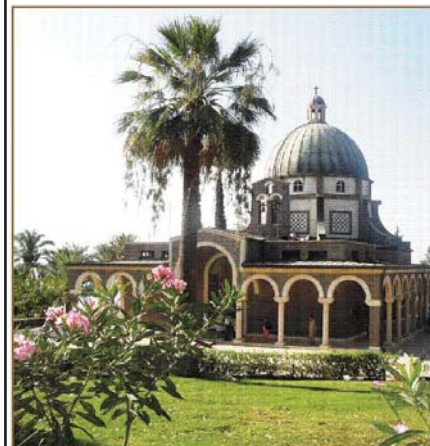
Speakers at the event included John Kirkby - the founder and International Director of Christians against Poverty (CAP), representatives from Nottingham Street Pastors and the international charity 'Betel' – working with the vulnerable and addicts. The last two speakers were Gareth Sands, Director of HMP Lowdham and the Deputy Chief Constable of Nottinghamshire Police, Chris Eyre. The event provided opportunities for people from local authorities, business, sport, the emergency services and the faith communities to meet, share ideas and projects and see how they could work together more closely in the future.

## Vote on how church brings in women bishops

Members of Diocesan Synod approved a motion, sent for discussion in dioceses from the Church of England’s General Synod, to move ahead with the proposal for the Bishops and Priests (consecration and ordination of women) Measure. Discussions were held on the consequences of the measure at a special synod on June 28th. Area

Dean for Nottingham South and Rector of the Society of Catholic Priest, the Revd Jonathan MacGillivray said it had taken many years of debate and prayer to get to the motion and it was important that when women are consecrated they are not second class bishops, and have full jurisdiction and authority. Chair of the House of Laity, Pam Bishop, told members that the

average person in the street would not care about their discussions and that it needed sorting out or the Church would lose credibility.

A following motion proposed by the Revd Richard Clark, bringing amendments to the original motion relating to Episcopal oversight was voted out, with 68 against, eight for the motion and four members abstaining.

Dr Hilborn said of his appointment “I am delighted that St John’s has asked me to be its next Principal. I have long admired the college’s innovative approach to theological education, and look forward to developing its vision and mission. The next few years promise to be both exciting and challenging for ministerial training in particular, and St John’s is well placed to meet the demands of future. I am grateful to Christina Baxter, the Council and the wider college community for all their prayers, support and good wishes as I prepare to take on this new role.”

Canon Dr Baxter said, “I welcome the appointment of David Hilborn as my successor. David brings many strengths to this post – international and ecumenical experience, a broad interest in theology shown in his publications at Evangelical Alliance and elsewhere, and proven experience in the field of Theological education. *Link Officer, The Revd Barbara Holbrook writes:*

At the end of March this year, Bishop Funginkosi retired as suffragan bishop in Natal. He had responsibility for the northern part of the Diocese. As I write, the process of finding a new suffragan bishop is still on-going. Their process is very different to ours, as the bishop is elected by the clergy from the clergy within the Diocese. This is the same for all three bishops (the two suffragans and the Diocesan bishop). Suitable candidates are nominated, and then an election takes place.

When we were visiting just before Bishop George retired I was discussing this with the diocesan clergy, as they were asking about our appointment process. I could see all of the issues around the politics of an election, and felt confident that the English way of appointing bishops was better! I was pulled up short, however, in one conversation. An aghast priest looked at me and said 'Well, don't you have ANY say in who your bishop is?' He was astounded at this fact, and I was humbled to think that I had just assumed that we were right and



they were wrong. Such is the challenge to us as we develop open and honest friendships with our brothers and sisters in Natal.

South Africa have their long winter holidays in July, so it will be a time to reflect on who their new leader should be.

**Please pray** for them all as the election continues.

**Pray** for the person who will be elected, and for those who may stand for election and not be successful.

**Pray** for the relationship between the three bishops in Natal as they lead the Diocese.

Finally **pray** for ourselves as we develop friendships across the

**Cyclists, walkers and ‘sitters’ needed for annual Sponsored Ride and Stride**

The annual effort to find cyclists, walkers and ‘sitters’ to help raise money for Nottinghamshire’s old churches and chapels is under way.

The annual Sponsored Ride and Stride, organised by the Nottinghamshire Historic Churches Trust, takes place on **Saturday, 10th September**, between 10am and 6pm and it is hoped over 250 churches and chapels of all denominations will take part in the effort.

The event is for both cyclists and walkers and each church maps out its own route, taking in an average of five or six churches, with riders and walkers being sponsored according to how many churches they visit. Individuals are allowed to have their own itinerary in regard to visiting a different number of churches.

Those taking part are offered refreshments at each venue they visit and some of the churches hold open days to coincide with the event which takes place on the same day countrywide and which raises annually around £1.5m for the National Churches Trust, which itself provides cash to help repair places of worship built before 1939.

Last year churches and chapels in Nottinghamshire managed to raise around £23,000 from the event, £2,400 of which comes from Gift Aid, the total being the best ever since the event has been taking place in Nottinghamshire.

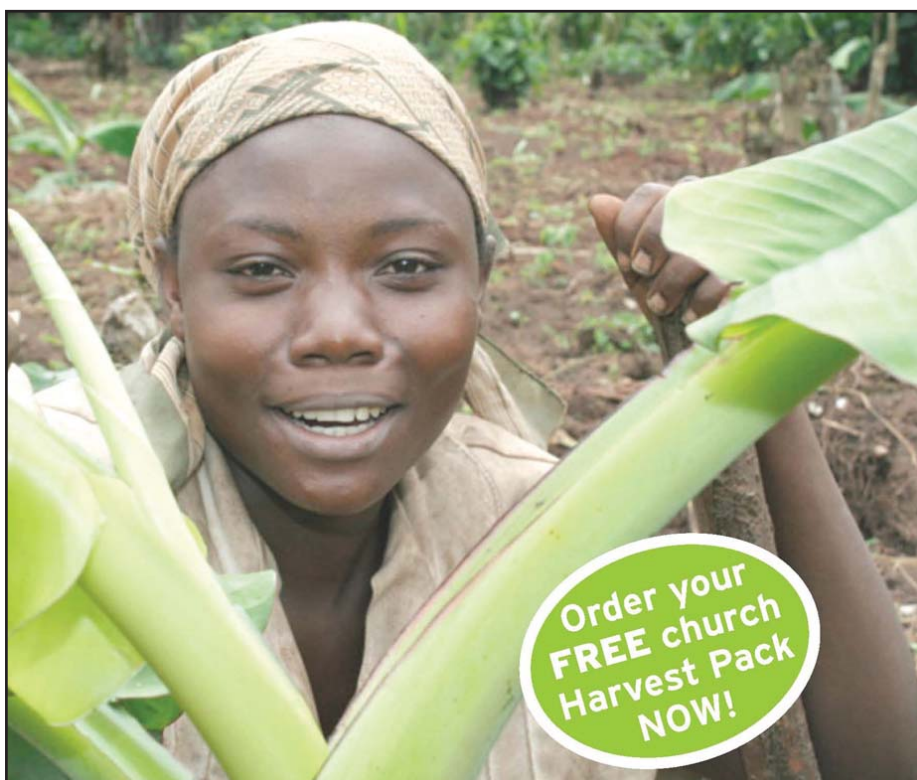
