

Archdeacon of Newark elected as Scottish Bishop

The Archdeacon of Newark, the Venerable Dr Nigel Peyton has been elected as the new Bishop of Brechin – overseeing the Dundee and Tayside area of the Scottish Episcopal Church.

Nigel said: “I am honoured to have been chosen and look forward to returning to serve in the diocese where my ministry and family life began. I am sad to be leaving Nottinghamshire after 26 enormously fulfilling years. My only regret is leaving not having seen Forest promoted to the Premiership!”

Nigel Peyton came from Scotland to Nottingham in 1985 as vicar of All Saints Church in inner city Nottingham. He went on to be Priest-in-Charge at Lambley, and was Chaplain to Nottingham Bluecoat School. He was appointed as a Ministry Development Adviser for the Diocese in 1991 and was made Archdeacon of Newark in 1999.



Nigel, who studied at Edinburgh University, was ordained at St Paul’s Cathedral in Dundee in 1976 and served in a number of parish and chaplaincy posts in Dundee before moving to Nottinghamshire.

Diocesan Mission & Events Trailer for the community

The Diocese now has a display trailer to use to support the Church's mission at public events and out in the community. The newly refurbished trailer is an Arizona Exhibition Trailer – with internal dimensions of 3.6 metres and external length including tow-bar of 5 metres approx. The trailer opens out with its own display material on the hinged wing panels and includes a lift canopy. It is equipped with electric hook-up, an LCD projector and loud speaker system.

There is also a limited amount of cupboard storage inside and folding chairs and a table are also supplied, as well as steps into the trailer.

This resource is a grass roots support to parishes and deaneries engaged in public space events in their communities. It provides a ready-made hub for activities and a focal point for advice and information. The trailer is used regularly as the worship and prayer focus for Calverton Car Boot church and has also been used at Newark Show as the diocesan trade stand. It is a versatile facility which can be adapted to a range of uses from a platform for worship or refreshment point to a stage for activities or an information and prayer station.

During the coming months as the diocese pilots its use, the trailer is available free of charge, although donations towards costs, including transport to events, are gratefully received. Diocesan Lay minister, Paul Howard, is overseeing the use of the trailer and will tow it to events. Paul is also able to offer advice about setting up events in the community and offer support as far as possible.

The trailer is available on a first come first served basis and booking enquiries can be made via email or phone.

Learn to listen and walk in another man's shoes

Link Officer, The Revd Barbara Holbrook writes:

July in Natal is the time for their long mid-winter holidays. The schools close for about three weeks and it's time off. For some of our friends who have family in the UK it's time to visit. This year at least one man from Natal will be visiting the Diocese, and hopefully we may get the chance to meet up with others who are over here visiting family.

It's good to keep up these friendships by visits, but there is more to it than face-to-face trips. Often the friendships go through quiet stages – we have times when we are busy with the day to

day lives and more than an occasional email is difficult. Then there are times when something comes up and it's good to talk to each other. Often the mark of our friendship is that we can pick up where we left off a few months ago as though it was just yesterday when we spoke.

One of the challenges of any visit is that it needs both the visitor and the visited to have the resources required. Flight costs have to be met, and hospitality given. When you visit some families in Natal you can tell that they don't have such resources. Hospitality means that they will offer you a drink, but at what cost to themselves? It is far too easy to refuse their offering because they



have so little, but sometimes in doing so you can take what they do have, a pride in the home that they have built and in their ability to offer you a seat and a drink.

If our friendship is to change us and help us to grow, we must learn to listen and to walk in another man's shoes. We see things through the eyes of our own culture, but if we look through their eyes we see not only their lives but ours in a new and challenging way.

So as we welcome our guests over the summer / winter break, pray for safety in travel, and that we will all grow in understanding of our own lives as well as those of the people of the Diocese of Natal.
